The Kimball City Council met in regular session Monday August 5, 2024 at the city office. The finance office did discover Corner Pantry Sprinklers and the Kimball Football Field Sprinklers were turned on and running without notifying the city office. The football field had used 163,800 gallons of water since being turned off last fall accounting for part of the water loss. They have since then been billed for the usage along with Corner Pantry.

The fire department received a PPE (Personal Protective Equipment) grant from the S.D. Department of Public Safety in the amount of \$3,596.00.
